

Message from the Board of Trustees

One of the Library Board's main goals for 2011 was to survey people in our service area to find out what more we can do to serve our community. In particular, we wanted to know who doesn't use the library, and why—whether there might be a lack of awareness of services, or whether there are groups in the community that we are, unintentionally, under-serving.

We delayed the launch of our survey until after municipal elections in November, so it ran into the Christmas season, but we nonetheless had a tremendous response. Almost 1500 people filled out the survey on paper or online, which works out to over 11% of the population in our service area. We couldn't be more pleased.

The survey firm is still busy analyzing data but we do have some rough results. Feedback about staff was very positive. In addition to high numerical rankings, well over 100 people took the time to write out compliments about the friendliness and helpfulness of staff, and another 279 people wrote comments about how much they appreciate the services the library provides to our community.

When we have a detailed report on the survey we will, of course, share it via our website and local media.

The Gibsons and District Public Library is a beloved and well supported community resource, but there is no question that change is on the horizon. The internet and the e-book revolution are changing the way that people read, research, and recreate, and that is reflected in our usage. Our circulation of physical materials was down 5% in 2011, while use of reference databases via our website went up an amazing 330%.

With technological change in mind and survey results in hand, in 2012 the board will be looking at 'big picture' goals and priorities for library services. Those, in turn, will inform a renewed Planning process, with a view to library expansion—something that has, frustratingly, been on the back burner for close to five years.

As we move forward in planning our library's future, we will continue to rely on the resourcefulness, creativity and flexibility of our staff and our Chief Librarian, and the tremendous support of the residents of the Town of Gibsons and the Sunshine Coast Regional District.

Finally, we would like to thank one of our most valuable supporters—Library Foundation. In 2011 they donated replacement study carrels and accessible desks for our computer stations, and some very popular eBook readers. Kobos, Kindles and Sonys can now be borrowed from the library, thanks to funding from the Foundation and TELUS, but you'll have to get in line because there's a waiting list!



Message from the Chief Librarian

In 2011 the Library expanded its scope in electronic media and formats. In January the Library became a free wi-fi zone. We also began adding electronic book copies to our Overdrive Advantage collection. Overdrive Advantage is for libraries such as ourselves, who are part of an OverDrive shared collection; with it we create a custom collection just for Gibsons Library card holders. This feature gives us the ability to purchase and offer additional popular titles--exclusively for our patrons.

We added a really remarkable database -- Library PressDisplay. PressDisplay provides instant online access to today's newspapers from around the world in full-color, full-page format. The everexpanding collection currently includes nearly 1,700 U.S. and international titles. Just like reading the familiar print edition, viewers can browse articles and other key content, such as pictures,

advertisements, classifieds, and notices.



In the fall we added another terrific database to our website – Mango Languages. Mango uses real-life situations and conversations to teach a new language. By listening to and repeating material based on native conversations, you'll not only learn the individual words and phrases, you'll know how they're used in practical situations and conversations. You'll learn more than

grammar, vocabulary and conjugation; you'll learn how to communicate.

Thanks to the generous support of the Gibsons & District Public Library Foundation we made pre-loaded eReaders available for loan. We are currently lending 3 Kobos, 3 Kindles, and 3 Sony eReaders. Each eReader has



approximately 10 popular book titles loaded for trouble free enjoyment.
